Governor Newsom appointments Douglas Parker to lead trouble agency

Department of Industrial Relations (Cal/OSHA) gets new “Chief”

First reported by the renowned Cal/OSHA Reporter Friday morning, an official announce was later released by Cal/OSHA media office (below).

We are pleased to share with you that Governor Gavin Newsom yesterday appointed Douglas Parker as chief of Cal/OSHA.

Douglas Parker, 50, of San Francisco, has been the executive director of Worksafe since 2016. He was deputy assistant secretary of labor at the Mine Safety and Health Administration at the U.S. Department of Labor from 2014 to 2015, and senior policy advisor and special assistant at the U.S. Department of Labor from 2009 to 2014. Douglas was a partner at Mooney, Green, Baker & Saindon from 2005 to 2009, where he was an associate from 2000 to 2005. He was a staff attorney at the United Mine Workers of America from 1997 to 2000, a sales and marketing director at Custom Engineering and Sales from 1993 to 1994 and radio press director for the Presidential Inaugural Committee from 1992 to 1993. Douglas was a radio press operations manager for the Democratic National Committee in 1992 and a staff assistant in the Office of Senator Paul Wellstone from 1991 to 1992. He earned a Juris Doctor degree from the University of Virginia School of Law.
